

Mission in Action

The St. Philips Mission/Outreach Committee has distributed \$500 to each of the following organizations.

- Magdalene House Chicago - a survivor-led two year residential program for women survivors of sex trafficking, prostitution and addiction.
- Journeys/The Road Home - provides shelter, services and housing to those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless in suburban Cook County.



- Hopeful Beginnings of St Mary's, Palatine - "Every child deserves a home." St. Mary's mission is to provide adoption services and support for women challenged by pregnancy and parenting including counseling services.
- Feed My Starving Children, world-wide - Hope starts with food. FMSC works with food partners to reduce problems of malnutrition. Nutrition allows children to grow, thrive and develop to their full potential.
- All Saints Food Pantry, Palatine - serving over 1400 families per month in northwestern Cook County

With the Help of the People of St. Philip's Episcopal Church - Magdalene House Chicago, Inc. 2022 Gala Raised...

Yvette Christy, of The Reclamation Project, raised awareness of hypocrisy. Where do you hail from she challenged the room: "How do you vote, where do you spend money, travel, what do you see past? Where does your religious beliefs guide you? Don't tell me you love me and then despise me from a divine place." Everyone stood - applauding - donors, staff, board, residents, in solidarity.

We raised over \$100k to sustain women for two years of cost-free living; to heal after addiction and sex trafficking. We raised the value of what one woman can do with her mind, hands, creativity, and voice.

We raised the value of one candle pour to \$1.5k in a bidding war for her first pour. \$1,500 for her conceptual thinking - a) What will she solve with her new skills in aromatherapy, and b) How will she market it through her new voice? The room went nuts as Jill and Chad Coe, our auctioneers, created a frenzy of value.

We raised the bar on what a room can do by collectively raising the value of the third candle to \$2.5k. Nearly fifty people donated via "paddle drop" setting value for the third candle. Claimed with pride on behalf of us all, including residents in Phase two at Magdalena House Chicago (MDH).

A single candle can light her way home and she can help keep it lit for others through dignity, integrity, love, friendship, family, safety, and healthy use of mind and soul.

It's not the candle light that beckons. It's each of us and she, who needs that flame more than anyone, is one of us. She is easily our daughter, sister, mother, friend, or co-worker.




